

LOANER GUN WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY

In consideration of Family Shooting Centers, Inc. ("FSCI") furnishing services, equipment, and/or the facilities and in consideration of my participation in clay shooting and other related activities (the "Sport"). I agree as follows: I fully understand and acknowledge that:

- (a) there are risks and dangers in my use of Sport equipment and my participation in the Sport;
- (b) my participation in the Sport, use of Sport equipment, and/or presence at FSCI's facilities may result in damage to or loss of personal property, personal injury, death, or other ailments that could cause serious disability;
- (c) these risks and dangers may be caused by the negligence of the shareholders, officers, directors, employees or agents of FSCI, the negligence of others, accidents, breaches of contract, forces of nature or other causes, and that risks and dangers may arise from foreseeable or unforeseeable causes, and;
- (d) I, on behalf of myself, my family, heirs, executors, administrators, representatives and assigns, assume all risks and dangers and all responsibility for any losses and/or damages which result from my participation in the Sport or presence in or on FSCI's facilities;
- (e) I have read and understand the Course Rules and have previously signed a Waiver and Release of Liability and will be responsible for any damage or abuse to the gun.
- (f) I have read and understand the loaner gun safety briefing on the back of this form.

LOANER GUN SAFETY BRIEFING

- **IF YOU ENCOUNTER ANY PROBLEMS WHATSOEVER WITH THE GUN, CEASE USE IMMEDIATELY AND CONTACT THE CLUBHOUSE.**
- For safety, all gun loaners MUST only use LVSC's factory loaded shotgun shells.
- If squad is using a 12ga. and a 20ga. shotgun, the 20ga. shells need to be kept separate from the 12ga. shells because a 20ga. shell will slide partially down the barrel of a 12ga shotgun and then a 12 ga. shell can be inserted. If fired in this condition, the gun barrel will blow up resulting in a catastrophic failure of the firearm's structural integrity which will cause serious bodily harm or death.
- The barrel of the shotgun must be over the station's front rail and pointed down range before inserting any shells into the gun and closing the gun.
- Trigger Safety – The trigger safety is on when engraved "S" is visible. Push it forward to turn safety off. On 20ga. guns the safety returns to safe position every time the gun is opened. **On 12ga. guns the safety does not return to safe mode**). Never assume the safety will protect against a discharge.
- Keep the action open at all times. For over/under or side by side, the gun is to be broke open. The action is only to be closed when: (1) you are in the station with the barrel over the front rail pointing down range (2) empty with the muzzle positioned up in a gun rack (3) empty with the muzzle in an upright position while transporting in a golf cart. If you are walking, the action must be kept open. For semi-autos or bolt actions, the ONLY time the action can to be closed is when you are in the station with the barrel over the front rail pointing down range and ready to fire. Always treat a gun as if it is loaded. Never pass the gun barrel past a person even when the gun is open.
- No practice mounts or swings outside of the shooting station.
- Do not put your finger on the trigger until you are ready to shoot
- Catch empty shells or pick up at end of shooting:
 - *For over/under guns*, after you take your two shots; catch the empty shells when opening the gun and throw them away, if they fall to ground, pick them up after your squad is done shooting.)
 - *Semi-automatic* - wait until your squad is finished shooting and then pick up the empty shells
- Misfire – KEEP THE GUN POINTED DOWN RANGE, Wait 15-30 seconds, then open the gun facing down range. DO NOT throw the live round into the garbage can. Keep the shell separate and bring it to the clubhouse for proper disposal when you are done shooting.
- Be aware of a "Squib" load which occurs when a fired shotgun shell does not have enough force behind it to force the shot and wad to exit the barrel, thus becomes stuck in the barrel. It can be identified by a muffled sound and/or light recoil. This type of malfunction can be extremely dangerous as failing to notice that the wad has become stuck in the barrel may result in another round being fired into the obstructed barrel. **[The Code Word for question 14 on page 1 is LVSC]** If fired in this condition, the gun barrel may blow up resulting in a catastrophic failure of the firearm's structural integrity which will cause serious bodily harm or death.
